GENERAL CONDITIONS



1. This Show is conducted under the Rules and Regulations of the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies and constitution and rules of this Society in addition to any special regulations, which appear within this schedule.
2. All riders and competitors compete at their own risk and no responsibility is accepted by Kenilworth Hall Show and Recreation Ground Assn Inc or its servants in any respect for account or mishap to competitors, animals, property or onlookers which may occur.
3. Whilst all reasonable care is taken, Kenilworth Hall Show and Recreation Ground Assn cannot accept any responsibility for any losses and/or damage or injury to or by any livestock, exhibits, equipment, vehicles or any other property whilst it is on the Kenilworth Showgrounds.
4. All QCAS affiliated Agricultural Societies have developed a comprehensive Agricultural Show Biosecurity Plan and all event organizers, competitors and spectators have a joint responsibility to ensure the successful implementation of a biosecurity plan. **Show Ground PIC QAMO1234**
5. DOGS must be kept in a closed float, a vehicle, or on a short leash and must be suitably muzzled as to prevent it from being able to injure or bite any person or animal whilst on the Kenilworth Showgrounds. Dog owners take full responsibility.
6. The exhibitors/competitors are required to ensure that they and all persons under their direction or control comply with all requirements of the current Workplace Health and Safety Act, and the Affiliated Show Society holds each exhibitor responsible to discharge its obligations to provide and maintain a safe place and system of work during occupation by the exhibitor/competitor of any area of the showgrounds.

7. All ring competitors are required to pay gate entry. No admission is refunded to competitors.
8. No entry will be received after commencement of each event and no ring shall be required to wait for a competitor who may be competing in another ring. Classes will not be held up for dual registered horses.
9. Any one horse can only compete once per event.
10. Stallions must not be left unattended. Any colt or stallion, 2 years and over shall be led with a stallion bit or chain and lead. No stallion is to compete in hacking events but may be ridden in breed events specified.



GENERAL CONDITIONS



11. The show committee has the right to alter, bring forward, delay classes or cancel an event or section.
12. A Maiden is a horse or pony that has not won a first prize in a similar event at an Agricultural Show. A Maiden hack is a hack that has not won a hack class in competition at an affiliated show. After winning a maiden hack class this horse will be recognized as a Novice.
13. A Novice is a horse or pony that has never won a championship in a similar event at an Agricultural Show.
14. Horses may be entered in Hack classes or Hunter Hack classes but not in both. However, a Hunter horse may compete in any Novice classes.
15. All prize money to be collected on the day.
16. NO ELECTRIC FENCES ARE ALLOWED ON THE GROUNDS DURING THE PERIOD OF THE SHOW. Safety officers are authorised to cut or remove same without notice. NO FENCE PANELS OR YARDS TO BE CONSTRUCTED.
17. Show Pony Hacks and Show Pony Hunter Hacks, 12.2 hands and under are to be ridden by a juvenile under 17 years of age; Show Pony Hacks and Show Hunter Pony Hacks over 12.2 hands and not exceeding 14 hands may be ridden by a juvenile or adult.
18. Any dispute must be lodged in writing to the committee secretary within 30 minutes of the completion of the event along with a \$50 fee. This amount will be forfeited if such protest is considered frivolous by the disputes committee of three persons appointed by the Show Committee. The only protests which will be considered are those made by competitors in the relevant event.
19. Biosecurity Horse Health Declarations to be filled out with nominations and event participants are reminded that they have a responsibility to maintain good biosecurity practices and should not knowingly take sick horses to an event. **Showground PIC number QAMO1234**
20. Work Place Health and Safety Rules and Regulations state – Only competitors and officials are allowed in the ring while events are being run. Spectators, Parents, Guardians or Strappers are not permitted in the horse arena during judging.
21. Welfare of the horse is paramount. Any abuse of a horse in any manner will not be tolerated.
22. Exhibitors shall at all times behave in a proper and courteous manner to judges show officials and other exhibitors.

6. No 2nd prize given if less than three (3) entries in any class
7. Classes may be deleted, combined or divided at the discretion of Judges and stewards on the day
8. No exhibit shall be removed from the pavilion before 4:00pm Saturday 20/09/2025
9. Prize money to be collected on the day of the Show [Saturday 20/09/2025] from 2:00pm in the Pavilion

Grease 2 sandwich tins 21cm x 6 cm.
Preheat oven to 180°C [160 – 170°C fan-forced].

Beat 4 eggs, $\frac{3}{4}$ cup [165g] white sugar and pinch of salt for 20 minutes, using an electric mixer.

Sift together twice: $\frac{1}{2}$ cup [60g] Cornflour; 2 dessertspoons Plain Flour, 2 tsp ground ginger, $1\frac{1}{2}$ tsp ground cinnamon, 1 tsp cocoa powder, $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp bi-carb soda and 1 tsp cream of tartar.

Fold into egg mixture. Finally, gently fold in 1 dessertspoon [12ml] Golden Syrup.

Pour mix evenly into prepared tins. Bake for 15 – 20 mins till cooked. Once cooked, turn cakes out on to wire rack covered with a tea-towel.

When completely cooled, sandwich two layers together with mock cream. Dust with icing sugar and top with glacé ginger.

Ingredients

60 g finely grated Kenilworth Vintage Cheddar Cheese
60 g butter
1 egg yolk
Pinch of salt
 $\frac{1}{4}$ tsp ground paprika
 $\frac{1}{2}$ cup Plain Flour

Method

1. Beat butter until creamy
2. Add grated cheese, egg yolk, salt and paprika.
3. Work in sifted flour
4. When blended, refrigerate for 1 hour.
5. Knead lightly, and roll out on to floured board to 5 mm thickness. Cut into rounds [approx. 35mm diameter].
