GENERAL CONDITIONS



1. This Show is conducted under the Rules and Regulations of the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies and constitution and rules of this Society in addition to any special regulations, which appear within this schedule.
2. All riders and competitors compete at their own risk and no responsibility is accepted by Kenilworth Hall Show and Recreation Ground Assn Inc or its servants in any respect for account or mishap to competitors, animals, property or onlookers which may occur.
3. Whilst all reasonable care is taken, Kenilworth Hall Show and Recreation Ground Assn cannot accept any responsibility for any losses and/or damage or injury to or by any livestock, exhibits, equipment, vehicles or any other property whilst it is on the Kenilworth Showgrounds.
4. All QCAS affiliated Agricultural Societies have developed a comprehensive Agricultural Show Biosecurity Plan and all event organizers, competitors and spectators have a joint responsibility to ensure the successful implementation of a biosecurity plan. **Show Ground PIC QAMO1234**
5. DOGS must be kept in a closed float, a vehicle, or on a short leash and must be suitably muzzled as to prevent it from being able to injure or bite any person or animal whilst on the Kenilworth Showgrounds. Dog owners take full responsibility.
6. The exhibitors/competitors are required to ensure that they and all persons under their direction or control comply with all requirements of the current Workplace Health and Safety Act, and the Affiliated Show Society holds each exhibitor responsible to discharge its obligations to provide and maintain a safe place and system of work during occupation by the exhibitor/competitor of any area of the showgrounds.

7. All ring competitors are required to pay gate entry. No admission is refunded to competitors.
8. No entry will be received after commencement of each event and no ring shall be required to wait for a competitor who may be competing in another ring. Classes will not be held up for dual registered horses.
9. Any one horse can only compete once per event.
10. Stallions must not be left unattended. Any colt or stallion, 2 years and over shall be led with a stallion bit or chain and lead. No stallion is to compete in hacking events but may be ridden in breed events specified.



GENERAL CONDITIONS



11. The show committee has the right to alter, bring forward, delay classes or cancel an event or section.
12. A Maiden is a horse or pony that has not won a first prize in a similar event at an Agricultural Show. A Maiden hack is a hack that has not won a hack class in competition at an affiliated show. After winning a maiden hack class this horse will be recognized as a Novice.
13. A Novice is a horse or pony that has never won a championship in a similar event at an Agricultural Show.
14. Horses may be entered in Hack classes or Hunter Hack classes but not in both. However, a Hunter horse may compete in any Novice classes.
15. All prize money to be collected on the day.
16. NO ELECTRIC FENCES ARE ALLOWED ON THE GROUNDS DURING THE PERIOD OF THE SHOW. Safety officers are authorised to cut or remove same without notice. NO FENCE PANELS OR YARDS TO BE CONSTRUCTED.
17. Show Pony Hacks and Show Pony Hunter Hacks, 12.2 hands and under are to be ridden by a juvenile under 17 years of age; Show Pony Hacks and Show Hunter Pony Hacks over 12.2 hands and not exceeding 14 hands may be ridden by a juvenile or adult.
18. Any dispute must be lodged in writing to the committee secretary within 30 minutes of the completion of the event along with a \$50 fee. This amount will be forfeited if such protest is considered frivolous by the disputes committee of three persons appointed by the Show Committee. The only protests which will be considered are those made by competitors in the relevant event.
19. Biosecurity Horse Health Declarations to be filled out with nominations and event participants are reminded that they have a responsibility to maintain good biosecurity practices and should not knowingly take sick horses to an event. **Showground PIC number QAMO1234**
20. Work Place Health and Safety Rules and Regulations state – Only competitors and officials are allowed in the ring while events are being run. Spectators, Parents, Guardians or Strappers are not permitted in the horse arena during judging.
21. Welfare of the horse is paramount. Any abuse of a horse in any manner will not be tolerated.
22. Exhibitors shall at all times behave in a proper and courteous manner to judges show officials and other exhibitors.

Class 27 Set Recipe Butterfly Cupcakes [6 required]

Ingredients:

200g unsalted Butter, softened
1 tsp Vanilla extract
1 cup Caster Sugar
3 eggs
2 ½ cups Self Raising Flour, sifted
½ cup milk

Method:

1. Preheat oven to 180°C (160°C fan-forced). Line two 12-hole, ½ cup-capacity muffin pans with paper cases.
2. Using an electric mixer, beat butter, vanilla and sugar in a small bowl until light and fluffy. Add eggs, 1 at a time, beating after each addition (mixture will separate at this stage).
3. Stir in by hand half the flour. Then stir in half the milk. Repeat with remaining flour and milk until combined.
4. Fill each hole in the muffin pan with 2 level tablespoons of mixture.
5. Bake for 15 to 17 minutes.
6. Stand cakes in pans for 2 minutes. Transfer to a wire rack to cool.

Decoration

1 cup raspberry jam
Mock cream: Ingredients - 2 tblsp butter, ½ cup sifted icing sugar, ½ tsp vanilla essence
Beat butter and icing sugar to a cream. Add vanilla essence; stir in well. When cakes are cool, use a sharp knife to cut a 2cm-deep x 3cm-wide piece from the top of each cake. Cut this section in half. Evenly spoon jam into each hole. Then spoon mocked cream over jam. Arrange cake tops over cream to form wings. Dust with icing sugar.

Class 28 Set Recipe Cheese Damper

1. Rub 60g grated butter and 1 cup of grated cheese (Kenilworth Dairies Cheese Label as proof of purchase) into 2 cups of S.R. Flour which has been seasoned with a pinch of salt. Mix should look like fine bread crumbs.
2. Make a well in the flour/butter combo; then add 1 cup of milk, stirring in with a flat-blade knife from the middle to the outer edge until all evenly combined.
3. Place mix onto floured surface and knead the dough with floured hands. Form into a round about 3 cm in height.
4. Place onto a greased baking slide; sprinkle top with 1/2 cup grated cheese, and then dot top with 1/2 cup grated butter. Bake at 220°C for about 25 minutes. When cooked and golden, the damper will sound hollow if tapped.

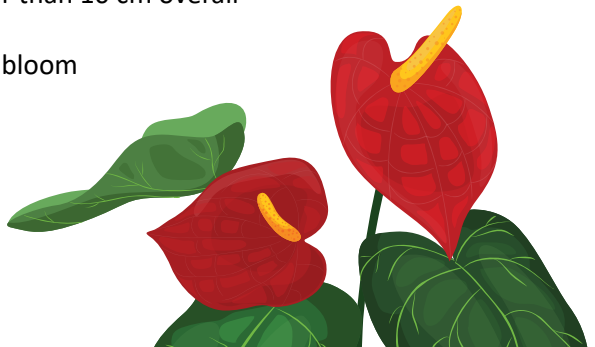

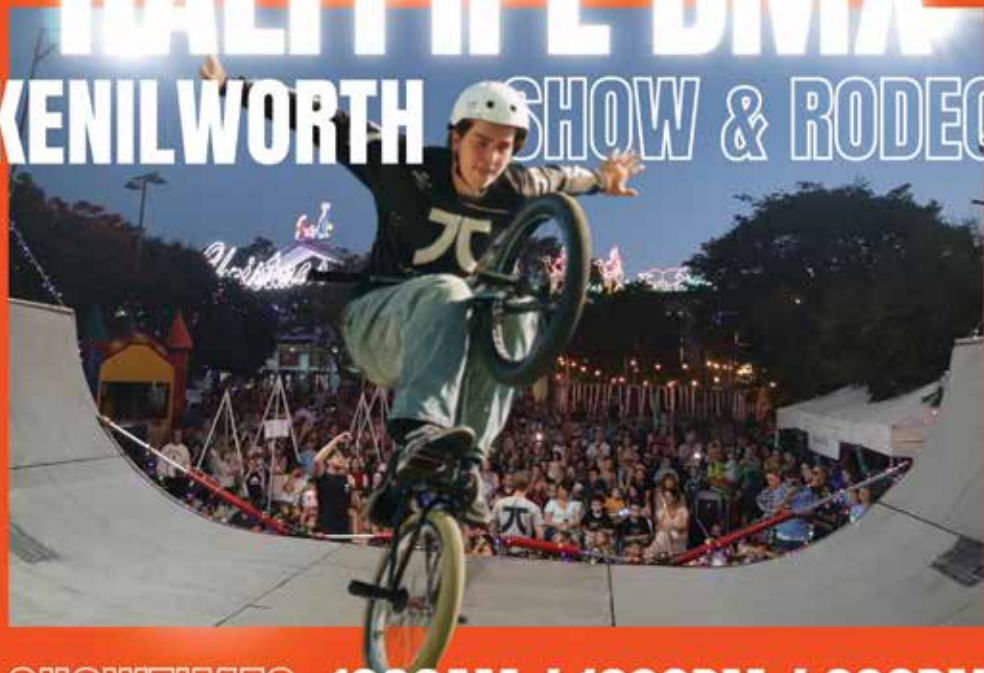
